

# Bookshare Today




An online library of accessible media for readers with print disabilities

***Bookshare believes that people with print disabilities should have the same ease of access to books and periodicals that people without disabilities enjoy.***


# Read Books in the DAISY Format (Digital Accessible Information System)

-  Flexible, versatile file format
-  Multi-modal reading on a computer
  - Visual presentation and/or synthetic speech
-  Easier to navigate
  - Chapters, paragraphs, and pages
-  Like HTML, plus some extra tags
-  Convert and play on MP3 player


# Read Books in the BRF Format (Braille Ready Format)

-  Use notetakers or refreshable Braille displays
-  Download books to embosser
-  Order hardcopy Braille books online through partnership with Braille Institute



<b>Physical Disability (PD)</b>	Disability that affects one's ability to read print, such as inability to hold a book or turn pages.	
<b>Learning or Reading Disability (LD)</b>	A specific language learning disability that significantly affects the ability to read printed material (typically for students who had an IEP).	

# What is the Difference between an Individual and Organizational Membership

## Individual Membership



-  Access to Bookshare **at home** on evenings, weekends, summer vacation. Access anywhere there is a computer or AT hardware!
-  **Student downloads** for herself / himself.

## Organizational Membership



-  Access to Bookshare **at school** for classroom reading.
-  **Staff** downloads books on behalf of student.

Bookshare encourages getting both memberships to get full access and maximum benefit!




# Going on to Postsecondary

“If I am continuing on with postsecondary education, how do I maintain my Bookshare membership?”

- ❑ Use the summer months to prepare for your new school.
- ❑ You will want to have an Individual Membership:  
You can sign yourself up (students under 18 need a parent or guardian’s permission) or your school can help you get an Individual membership.  
Your new postsecondary school might have an organizational membership; you can be added to that.

# Signing up is Easy!

-  Step 1 – Go to *Sign Up Today* on the booksahre website; fill in your contact information.
-  Step 2 – Sign and mail/fax the user agreement.
-  Step 3 – Mail or fax your proof of disability.
-  Once Bookshare gets all of your paperwork we will send you a welcome email within 2 business days. This will include your user name and password.


# Download Victor Reader Soft



# What to do when you can't find a book-

 Look through other resources

- RFBD
- National Library service
- Find the alternative media center on campus - talk with Disability service office for appropriate steps
  - ◇ Purchase the book for chopping and scanning
  - ◇ Not able to share scanned files without publisher permission
  - ◇ If the book is already scanned on campus you still need to have proof of purchase (receipt)

 Textbook request – contact us – it can take up to a month or longer.





# Advocacy on the transition process:

-  Students might consider contacting the Disability Resource Offices first, as they explore post-secondary opportunities.
-  If you a student is not continuing on to post-secondary education, what happens to the Bookshare membership?
-  When does a student contact the DRO offices? When does a student start to research schools? The sooner the better!
  - Plan in-person meetings to look at schools.
  - Consider bringing copies of high school files including any assessment reports and write ups on the accommodations provided during high school.
  - Tip: Have at least four copies of the paperwork for home, high school, post-secondary and personal/reference use.
