






What is a Learning Disability

- Average or above average intelligence
- A pattern of uneven abilities
- A processing problem presumed to be due to central nervous system dysfunction [taking in, sorting, and retrieving information]
- Manifested by significant difficulties in the acquisition and use of;
 - *Listening * speaking *reading *writing *reasoning *mathematics *social skills *time management



Basic information processing model





Definition

Learning disabilities, commonly termed "Hidden Disabilities" since the individual looks and acts normal, are often misunderstood by parents, teachers, and leaders. Proper diagnosis is often overlooked since coping strategies are strong.



Definition of a learning disability



- Learning disabilities (LD) are primarily related to the way people deal with information
- May result from a neurological dysfunction
- People who have a learning disability tend to have at least average intelligence
- Performance on tasks affected by LD tends to be well below average


What a learning disability is not...

- An intellectual disability
- The result of:
 - 1. Poor academic background
 - 2. Emotional disturbance
 - 3. Lack of motivation
 - 4. Visual and auditory dysfunction
 - 5. Physical handicap
- A homogeneous group of disorders Every one is different

Is there a Process to Follow?

Checklist to Identify the issues.

- √ Check for physical causes of a problem
- ✓ Communicate with the teacher
- ✓ Call in the experts
- ✓ Contact support networks
- ✓ Consume education on the subject
- ✓ Consistency of management styles
- ✓ Compare so you have a perception check
- ✓ Consult with the TEAM



So you have a Problem...

- If it is your problem, what now?
- Mentoring?
- What about all that "alternative advice"?
- ➡ How are the "home team" handling this?
- What is the most important thing I can do?



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
